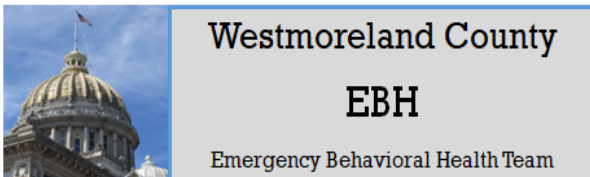

Who is EBH?

EBH stands for Emergency Behavioral Health Team.

EBH members are trained in various crisis response modalities to assist with mitigating the impact of stress from a critical event. These can include; DCORT, CISM, PFA, and/or specialty response.

They provide services to individuals impacted by critical incidents both natural or manmade.

EBH is coordinated by: and lead by Westmoreland County Behavioral Health and Developmental Services and the EBH Coordinator.



Where would EBH deploy?

EBH can deploy to:

- Disaster Recovery Centers (DRC)
- Emergency Operation Centers (EOC) if asked
- Community
- Shelters
- Schools
- Accident and fire events if requested
- Exercises and drills
- First Responder Support (Fire EMS, Police)
- Any critical incident that has occurred and there is a need.



What can EBH provide ?

EBH would:

- Assess psychological impact of incidents
- Provide support, education and referral assistance
- Provide outreach in the community, at shelters, in Disaster Recovery Centers, and local events
- Assist in assessing the impact of disasters and work in the Incident Command Structure to provide support or referral
