SUPPORTS COORDINATION (SC)

Empowering every individual to live fully, with dignity and inclusion.

Your guide to services, opportunities, and everyday life in the community.

Supports Coordinators work with people of all ages with intellectual disabilities or autism.

They can connect you to services and monitor progress so you receive the care you need when you need it.

EARLY INTERVENTION (EI)

Supporting your child's growth and development from the very beginning.

We help families of infants and toddlers, under the age of three, with developmental delays or disabilities.

Through no-cost evaluations and individualized family service plans, we connect you with resources and therapeutic providers to support your child's early learning.



CERTIFIED PEER SPECIALIST (CPS)

Using lived experience to inspire hope, build connection, and empower others on their recovery journey.

A Certified Peer Specialist (CPS) is someone who brings the power of lived experience to their work, having faced mental health challenges and moved forward through resilience and recovery.

Peer Support Services provide connection, encouragement, and understanding from someone who has truly "been there," helping individuals build confidence on their path to wellness.

Specially trained, CPS professionals offer a unique perspective that complements traditional clinical services, rather than replacing them.



STUDENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SAP) LIAISON

Breaking down barriers so students can succeed in school and life.

SAP Liaisons partner with schools to help students overcome challenges creating barriers to learning.

Services include social skills groups, linking to behavioral health or drug and alcohol services, and connections to community resources.



TARGETED CASE MANAGEMENT (TCM)

Guiding you toward recovery, wellness, and hope.

Personalized support to help you set goals and access the services needed to thrive.

Our case managers meet with you and your family to assist in identifying treatment plan goals. We provide advocacy, resources, and referrals.

Specialized support is also available for those leaving the hospital or involved in the justice system.



CRIMINAL JUSTICE LIAISONS (CJL)

Helping individuals navigate the justice system with compassion and connection.

Our liaisons work directly with magisterial offices across Westmoreland County.

They provide support during hearings, connect you to community services, and offer diversion options towards recovery instead of repeat incarceration.
